Credit Hours Transfer Rule

Resolved at the Academic Affairs Meeting of the Institute on October 9, 1995 Approved at the Academic Affairs Meeting of the University on October 20, 1995 Resolved at the Academic Affairs Meeting of the Institute on September 17, 1999 Approved at the Academic Affairs Meeting of the University on March 30, 2000

- Article 1 The Credit Hours Transfer Rule is formulated in accordance with the "National Central University Credit Hours Transfer Rules."
- Article 2 Graduate students who have completed the graduate courses of the University with passing grades (70 points) without including the graduation credit hours of the last school year may apply for credit hours transfer. If the waived courses applied for are the courses of the Institute, it will be accepted. If the waived courses applied for are courses of other Institutes of the University, it must be recognized by test or review at the Academic Affairs Meeting of the Institute. However, the credit hour transfer is limited to one third of the graduation credit hours and it is limited to one application.
- Article 3 Graduate students who have completed the graduate courses of the University with passing grades including the graduation credit hours of the last school year may not apply for credit hours transfer. If the graduation credit hours are excluded and the course is a core course of the Institute, an application can be filed for waiving the core course or other optional courses that are to be reviewed at the Academic Affairs Meeting of the Institute.
- Article 4 The credit hours that were earned from the University's School of Professional and Continuing Education that are authorized by the Ministry of Education five years before the enrollment may apply for a waiver of the optional courses of the Institute but not the core courses that are to be reviewed at the Academic Affairs Meeting of the Institute. However, the credit hour transfer is limited to one third of the graduation credit hours and it is limited to only one application.
- Article 5 The Credit Hours Transfer Rule is enforced after the resolution reached at the Academic Affairs Meeting of the Institute and reported to and approved by the

Academic Affairs Meeting of the University and so are the amendments.
